Staff is requesting the approval of the attached Inter Local Agreement between the City of Muskegon and the County of Muskegon to submit a joint application to the Department of Homeland Security for equipment. The Courts and Public Safety Committee approved the submission of an application to the Department of Homeland Security on June 4, 2013 for the purchase of equipment by the County of Muskegon. The following day the City of Muskegon contacted County staff to see if the City and the County could submit a joint application. Staff believes that it would be better to submit a joint application with the County of Muskegon acting as the applicant and fiduciary rather than two municipalities submitting an application in a highly competitive environment. If both applications were to proceed as separate applications, neither would likely be approved given the changes in the funding allocations. The funding agency requires an Inter Local Agreement be submitted with the application if it is a multi-jurisdictional application.  The Inter Local Agreement defines the roles of the City and the County and the source of the match for the City's funding request. This Agreement is made and entered into on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2013 by and between the County of Muskegon, acting by and through its governing body, the Board of Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as "County," located at 990 Terrace Street, Muskegon, Michigan 49442 and City of Muskegon, acting by and through its governing body, the City Commission, hereinafter referred to as "City," located at 933 Terrace Street, Muskegon, Michigan 49443-0536, both of Muskegon County, (referred from time-to-time as either Parties or Governing Bodies) witnesseth:

# **RECITALS:**

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made under the authority of MCL 244.504, the "Urban Cooperation Act," and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has agreed to serve as the applicant/fiscal agent for a joint application for funding under the Port Security Grant, Department of Homeland Security; WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions, hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS, each governing body find that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interest of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the provision of

costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this Agreement' and

WHEREAS, the CITY agrees to pay the COUNTY Twenty-six thousand and sixty three dollars and seventy cents (\$26,063.70) in cash match for the grant, if awarded;

WHEREAS, the CITY and COUNTY believe it to be in their interests to allocate the funds if awarded, as specified in this Agreement.

THEREFORE, THE CITY AND COUNTY agree as follows:

# **RECITALS:**

- 1. CITY agrees to pay COUNTY Twenty-six thousand and sixty three dollars and seventy cents (\$26,063.70) for the cash match.
- 2. COUNTY agrees to pay CITY Seventy-eight thousand, one hundred ninety one dollars and ten cents (\$78,191.10) from the Port Security Grant, if awarded. The CITY will be responsible for its actions in the use of equipment purchased under this Agreement and the COUNTY shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the purchase or the use of the equipment.
- 3. The CITY will be responsible for submitting the quarterly reports to the COUNTY by the third day of the month following the quarter in the fashion required by the COUNTY.
- 4. The CITY will be responsible for the accuracy of all data submitted to the COUNTY for the submission of reports to the Department of Homeland Security and will be liable for penalties as a result of submitting the data late or any inaccurate data.

The County Board of Commissioners approved a contract with a two year renewal provision with the Muskegon Community Health Project on November 8, 2012 to locate a Community HUB for the Michigan Pathways to Better Health program. Muskegon County is one of three counties that is implementing the Pathways project to reduce the health care costs of Medicaid and Medicare beneficiaries with two or more chronic diseases in the State of Michigan. The initial contract paid for the 45% of the time of the Grants Coordinator to be the HUB Director and 15% of the Grant Specialist to support the HUB administrative operations for the period of December 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. To date, the HUB has referred 500 participants to the Pathways program. The Pathways program is also paying MATS for transportation for the participants on a pilot basis, which will likely be continued for the next two years of the grant period. In addition, the Health Department will be applying for funding for a project that is supported by the HUB in the upcoming fiscal year.  The second grant year will commence on July 1, 2013 and end on June 30, 2014. An amendment to the contract extending the agreement is attached for your review and approval. 1,250 people are to be served in the second year of the grant. The grant amendment would increase the total compensation as a result in the increase in the percentage of time being spent by the Grant Coordinator and Grant Specialist to provide administrative support for the project.

WHEREAS, the Muskegon Community Health Project (hereinafter called "the Health Project") whose address is 565 West Western Ave.; Muskegon, MI 49440, County of Muskegon, whose address is 990 Terrace St., Muskegon, MI 49442, hereinafter called "the Contractor," do mutually desire to amend the Agreement entered into the 7th day of January 2013 for Community Hub services in connection with the Michigan Pathways to Better Health Project, and;

WHEREAS, the Health Project and The Contractor desire to amend said Agreement in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutual agree as follows:

- 1. Extend the Agreement effective July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.
- 2. The Health Project is purchasing ½-time of Judy Kell (1,040 hrs) and Mike Baau (1,040 hrs). Additional time up to 75% can be purchased if the project work load warrants the increase. Compensation will be adjusted, accordingly, based on their current base salary and fringe benefit rates.
- 3. Change the "Method of Payment" in Attachment A, as follows below.
  - Total compensation will be \$122,600 for the 12-month period.
  - Monthly payments of \$10,216.66 will be made by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month, beginning with the first payment in August 2013 and the last payment of \$10,216.74 in July 2014.
- 4. All other terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement shall stay in force.

This Agreement is made and entered into on the \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2013, by and between the County of Muskegon, acting by and through its governing body, the Board of County Commissioners, located at 990 Terrace Street, Muskegon, Michigan 49442 and the City of Muskegon, acting by and through its governing body, the City Commission, located at 933 Terrace Street, Muskegon, Michigan 49443-0536, and the City of Muskegon Heights, acting by and through its governing body, the City Council, located at 2724 Peck Street, Muskegon Hts., MI 49444, all of Muskegon County, State of Michigan, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, the CITY OF MUSKEGON has agreed to serve as the applicant/fiscal agent for the joint funds under the: Justice Assistance Grant(Local Solicitation) as the Bureau of Justice Assistance has designated the allocation to the law enforcement communities in Muskegon County as a disparate allocation; and

**WHEREAS**, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions, hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS, each governing body find that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interest of all parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the breakdown of allocated funding agreed upon by those entities involved in the disparate funding is \$ 27,549 to the CITY OF MUSKEGON and \$ 16,346 to the CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF MUSKEGON, CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS and COUNTY OF MUSKEGON believe it to be in their best interests to allocate the JAG funds as specified in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY OF MUSKEGON, CITY OF MUSKEGON AND CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS agree as follows:

# **AGREEMENT**

- 1. THE CITY OF MUSKEGON will act as the fiscal agent/applicant agency.
- 2. The total eligible joint allocation for the disparate jurisdictions of \$ 43,895 will be allocated as follows: COUNTY OF MUSKEGON \$ 0; CITY OF MUSKEGON \$27,549; CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS \$ 16,346
- 3. Each municipality will be responsible for its actions in the use of any equipment purchased under this Agreement and the fiscal agent shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the purchase of the use of the equipment.
- 4. The CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS will be responsible for submitting quarterly reports to the CITY OF MUSKEGON by the third day of the month following the quarter in the reporting fashion required by the CITY OF MUSKEGON and for any month in which an expenditure under the grant has occurred the CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS will submit a reimbursement request to the CITY OF MUSKEGON by the third day of the following month along with backup documentation such as invoices.
- 5. The CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHTS will be responsible for the accuracy of all data submitted to the CITY OF MUSKEGON for submission to the Bureau of Justice

- Programs and will be liable for penalties as a result of submitting the data late and for any inaccurate data.
- 6. Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against the CITY OF MUSKEGON passing from this program or from the CITY OF MUSKEGON HEIGHT's expenditure of the JAG funds.
- 7. By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intent to create any obligations, express or implied, other than those set out herein. Further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

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# PUBLIC DEFENDER AGREEMENT WITH ANGELLA R. GUERRERO

THIS AGREEMENT, is entered into effective as of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2013, by and between the County of Muskegon, a Michigan municipal corporation, and the 60<sup>th</sup> District Court, hereinafter collectively referred to as "County", and ANGELLA R. GUERRERO, hereafter referred to as "Public Defender".

# WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County of Muskegon is in need of a continuing, just, effective, and economical system for providing attorneys at County expense to defend those individuals who are charged with misdemeanor offenses, criminal contempt of court, and/or probation violations and cannot retain private counsel due to indigence; and

WHEREAS, the system which appears to offer the most satisfactory fulfillment of that need is that of a contract between Muskegon County and one or more law firms to provide such services as may be needed; and

WHEREAS, ANGELLA R. GUERRERO, as referenced above has represented that she is ready, willing, and able to provide such services on a contract basis; and

WHEREAS, the 60<sup>th</sup> District Court for the County of Muskegon is authorized, pursuant to Administrative Order 2008-03J, which is hereby incorporated by reference and attached hereto as Exhibit A, to appoint counsel for indigent parties; and

WHEREAS, the 60<sup>th</sup> District Court, by and through Chief Judge Maria Ladas Hoopes, has appointed Angella R. Guerrero to function in the capacity of "Public Defender:;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties do hereby mutually agree as follows:

# **AGREEMENT**

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be deemed effective from July 1, 2013, through September 30, 2013.
- 2. Angella R. Guerrero agrees to provide the legal defense services for all appointed indigent criminal defendants charged with misdemeanors, criminal contempt of court, and/or probation violations requiring and obtaining court appointed counsel during the term of this Contract.
- 3. If it is judicially determined that a person accused of a misdemeanor, contempt of court, and/or probation violation is entitled to court appointed counsel, then the 60<sup>th</sup> District Court for Muskegon County shall appoint, Angella R. Guerrero, functioning in the capacity of "Public Defender", or such other appointed public defender in such matters as the Court may deem appropriate, to represent said accused and, from time to time, when necessary, Angella R. Guerrero may utilize other members of her firm to fulfill the obligations hereunder.

Angella R. Guerrero may assign new representation of the accused person to another attorney from her law firm or associated with her law firm, provided, however, the other attorney delegated the case is capable of and shall provide constitutionally satisfactory services.

- 4. That, for the performance of the above described services, the County agrees to pay Angella R. Guerrero the sum of Eleven Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$11,875). Said sums will be paid on a monthly basis in equal monthly installments. Said installments shall be subject to pro-ration in the event of termination of this Agreement.
- 5. Angella R. Guerrero agrees that her obligations under this Agreement to represent indigent criminal defendants shall take precedence over any and all other commitments that she might have in the course of her legal practice.
- 6. Angella R. Guerrero shall perform the services under this Agreement as an independent contractor and not an employee of the County. Ms. Guerrero understands and acknowledges that she is not entitled to any benefits of a County employee including, but not limited to vacation, sick leave, administrative leave, health insurance, disability insurance, retirement, unemployment insurance, workers' compensation and protection of tenure.
- 7. County shall not be responsible for paying any taxes on Angella R. Guerrero's behalf. Should County be required to do so by State, Federal or local taxing agencies, Ms. Guerrero agrees to promptly reimburse County for the full value of such paid taxes plus interest and penalty, if any. These taxes shall include, but not be limited to, the following, FICA (Social Security), unemployment insurance contributions, income tax, disability insurance and workers' compensation insurance.
- 8. This Agreement will remain in force and effect beyond the period hereof pending the execution of a new agreement in the event both parties hereto express a desire to continue same, either pending negotiation of a new rate, development of a new Agreement, or change in appointment by the 60<sup>th</sup> District Court. In the case of such interim continuation, Angella R. Guerrero shall be paid at the same rate, subject to monthly proration of services performed.
  - 9. This Agreement may be terminated by the County or 60<sup>th</sup> District Court if:
  - A. Angella R. Guerrero fails to perform her obligation under this Agreement or has not provided adequate counsel for those individual defendants she is appointed to represent in a manner satisfactory to the 60<sup>th</sup> District Court for the County of Muskegon, or
    - B. Change of law relieves County of obligation to fund such services, or
  - C. The 60<sup>th</sup> District Court elects to terminate Angella R. Guerrero's appointment as a Public Defender.
- 10. This Agreement may be terminated by Angella R. Guerrero upon thirty (30) days advance written notice of her resignation.

- 11. Angella R. Guerrero shall be required to keep adequate records of all appearances and services on behalf of defendants represented under this Agreement and shall make such records available to the Muskegon County 60<sup>th</sup> District Court and Muskegon County Board of Commissioners. Such bodies shall reasonably direct Angella R. Guerrero to provide written explanation when cases are referred due to conflict, to conflict contract attorney for payment pursuant to conflict contract.
- 12. It is understood that County, through its Board of Commissioners, is solely undertaking funding of this program without undertaking any supervisory responsibility whatsoever.
- 13. Angella R. Guerrero agrees to indemnify and hold County harmless from any and all complaints filed against County by third party as a result of or attributable to acts or omissions of Angella R. Guerrero to this Contract. Angella R. Guerrero agrees to provide and maintain during the term of this Contract, malpractice insurance coverage at a minimum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) per incident and to provide proof of same to County upon request.
- 14. County agrees to reimburse Angella R. Guerrero for costs she incurs for serving subpoenas on witnesses.
