NAME CHANGE INSTRUCTIONS

A Petition to Change Name may be filed by any adult who has been a resident of Muskegon County for at least one year.

If the name change is for a minor child, they must be at least one (1) year old. **Both biological parents must sign the Petition**, unless the non-custodial parent has had no contact with the minor child and has paid no support for at least two (2) years; or, if the non-custodial parent was convicted of child abuse **and** the child or a sibling of the child was a victim (a copy of the Judgment of Sentence must be attached).

The Statute and Court Rules governing Name Change proceedings are: MCL 711.1 through 711.3 and MCR 3.613. Court forms, additional information, rules and requirements may be found at the following website: http://courts.michigan.gov/scao/selfhelp/family/nc help.htm

- 1. File a PETITION TO CHANGE NAME (form PC51) and pay the filing fee of \$175, plus an additional \$12.00 fee for a certified copy of the Order at the end of the case (which you will need). Please note: cash, money order or credit card only no personal checks. The credit card company will charge you a nominal fee for using the credit card. Bring a certified copy of your birth certificate with you when you file. The clerk must see the certified copy. We will then make a copy for our file.
- 2. If you are 22 years of age or older, you must be fingerprinted. Your fingerprints can be done at the Muskegon County Sheriff Office. The charge having your fingerprints taken at the Sheriff's Department is \$15.00. Fingerprints are only done until 4:00 p.m. on weekdays.
- 3. After you have had your fingerprints taken, mail a copy of the PETITION TO CHANGE NAME, the fingerprint card and the appropriate payment to the Michigan State Police. The fee must be made payable to the State of Michigan. Please call the State Police Office at 517-241-0606 for the correct fee amount.

Once the Federal Bureau of Investigation has reviewed its records and reported the information to the Michigan State Police, the Michigan State Police will send a report to the court regarding any criminal records. This takes approximately eight (8) weeks.

- 4. If the person whose name is to be changed is under the age of 22, no fingerprints are required, therefore, the hearing date can be scheduled by the judicial secretary approximately 45 days from the date of the Petition.
- 5. Please call the judge's office eight (8) weeks after you forwarded your fingerprints to the Michigan State Police to see if the report has been received by the Court.
- 6. If the report has been received, you need to schedule the hearing date with the judge's secretary. The judge's secretary will inform you of the date and time of the hearing. **This hearing should be set in approximately 45 days**. You must insert this hearing date on the PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF HEARING FOR NAME CHANGE.
- 7. Complete the form entitled PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF HEARING FOR NAME CHANGE. This must be published in one of the publications listed on the PUBLICATIONS LIST enclosed in this packet. PLEASE NOTE:

 THIS NOTICE MUST BE PUBLISHED ONE TIME AT LEAST 14 DAYS

 PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE HEARING. Timing is very important! If the publication is not done at least 14 days prior to the hearing date, you may need to publish again and re-schedule the hearing.
- 8. The original PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF HEARING FOR NAME
 CHANGE, and the receipt that you paid for the publication must be
 filed with the Circuit Court Records Office on the 6th floor as soon as possible.
- 9. You must to forward **proof of this publication to the Circuit Court**Records Office prior to the court hearing.
- 10. You must attend the hearing on the date and time stated in the Notice of Hearing. If the change is for a minor child, the parent must also be in attendance.

- 11. Prepare the ORDER FOLLOWING HEARING ON PETITION TO CHANGE NAME (PC52) and bring it to your hearing.
- 12. If the Petitioner has a criminal record, and pursuant to Section 711.1 of the Probate Code of 1939, "...the <u>Court</u> shall forward the Order to the Criminal Records Division of the Michigan State Police and to one or more of the following:
 - The Department of Corrections if the person named in the order is in prison or on parole or has been imprisoned or released from parole in the immediately preceding 2 years
 - The sheriff of the county in which the individual named in the order was last convicted if the individual was incarcerated in a county jail or released from a county jail within the immediately preceding 2 years
 - The court that has jurisdiction over the individual named in the order if the individual named in the order is under the jurisdiction of the family division of the circuit court or has been discharged from the jurisdiction of that court within the immediately preceding 2 years."
- 13. If the Petitioner wishes to change the name on the birth certificate, the certified order may be mailed to the Vital Records Office in the state of birth, with an Application to Record Court-Ordered Legal Name Change to a Michigan Birth Record form, which can be found at the County Clerk's Office.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR NAME CHANGE

Every person 22 years of age or older whose name appears on the "Petition to Change Name" must follow these instructions before the court can act on the petition.

Pursuant to Michigan law, every person 22 years of age or older who is requesting a name change must have a complete set of fingerprints taken at a local police agency. Those fingerprints will be used by the Michigan State Police and Federal Bureau of Investigation to check criminal records. The Michigan State Police will send a report to the court regarding any criminal records.

If you have a criminal record, it will be presumed that you are seeking the name change with fraudulent intent. You must prove to the court that the name change is not being sought with fraudulent intent.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. File the "Petition to Change Name" (form PC 51) with the circuit court and pay the filing fee.
- 2. Make one copy of the completed "Petition to Change Name" (form PC 51).
- 3. Go to your local police agency for the fingerprint card and to have your fingerprints taken. The police agency will advise you of the appropriate fee. Take a copy of the "Petition to Change Name" with you.
- 4. After you have had your fingerprints taken, mail the copy of the "Petition to Change Name," the fingerprint card, and the appropriate fee to the Michigan State Police. The fee must be made payable to the State of Michigan. Mail to:

5. The Michigan State Police will review your criminal records and will forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Once the Federal Bureau of Investigation has reviewed its records and reported the information to the Michigan State Police, the Michigan State Police will send a report to the court.

6. After the court receives the required report from the Michigan State Police, the court can schedule a

hearing on the "Petition to Change Name."
 The court will mail you a notice when the required report is received. You must give the court a preaddressed, postage-paid envelope for mailing this notice.
 Contact the court eight weeks after you mail or deliver your fingerprint card to the Michigan State Police to find out if the required report has been received.
