A. Landfill Expansion – Golder Associates Presentation

Chair Shaw read from the bylaws and the responsibilities of this committee.

Greg Leverence provided a background on Golder and their experience working with the County's landfill. Greg Leverence introduced Blaine Litteral and Daniel Schaafsma from Golder. Blaine Litteral presented (attached).

Chair Shaw asked if there's been communication with Egelston Township regarding the expansion. Greg Leverence stated they meet with Egelston Township a few years ago and Egelston Township is aware of the expansion plan for the County.

Doug Wood asked about payments made to Moorland Township. Commissioner Foster explained there are Fire Service Agreements in place for fire protection/emergency medical services provided to the Wastewater site and Solid Waste site. Commissioner Foster stated both Egelston and Moorland are paid equal amounts.

Doug Wood asked if there would be a leak detection system. Blaine Litteral stated there will be as required by Part 115.

Chair Shaw referred to the isolation distance map and asked what the boxes were in reference to. Blaine Litteral explained it was taxable parcels with the property owner's name. Greg Leverence stated properties with domiciles within the required setback distances have been acquired by the County.

Chair Shaw asked if the gas still went to Eagle Alloy and Sun Chemical. Greg Leverence stated that was correct.

Chair Shaw stated this is the beginning phase of a process that will move to the State of Michigan for a detailed review and approval.

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B. Consistency Application

of consistency.



Project Summary

- Proposed 54-acre lateral expansion west of the existing Muskegon County Landfill
- Consistency review requested to allow a Part 115 Construction Permit Application to be submitted to EGLE

Consistency Review Goals

MUSKEGON COUNTY LANDFILL

Determine the Application is Consistent with the 1998 Solid Waste Plan Update Submitted on August 22, 2000, and Subsequently Approved and Modified in a July 12, 2001, letter by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality

- Lateral expansion of the existing facility
- Confirm operations and related activities
- Document in a Letter of Consistency for the Muskegon County Landfill

Consistency Review Procedure

MUSKEGON COUNTY LANDFILL

Following this meeting presenting the consistency application, the Solid Waste Plan requires the Committee:

- Withing 30 days, determine the application is consistent with the Plan and issue a letter of consistency or notify the applicant that it is inconsistent with the Plan
- ➢ If found inconsistent with the Plan, the applicant has 30 days to resubmit a revised application
- The committee has 30 additional days to review the resubmitted plan



Reasons for the Proposed Expansion

- Provide continued solid waste disposal capacity beyond the current facility to meet Muskegon County's future residential and business needs
- Develop a Modern Disposal Facility Consistent with current state of practice that complies with applicable State and Federal requirements

Project Description

- Site to be located, designed, constructed, and closed in conformance with Part 115 requirements with regulatory approval
- Operation will be consistent with current facility and subject to regulatory review
- Environmental monitoring will be implemented in conformance with State requirements and subject to regulatory review



Siting Requirements

- Located on property owned by Muskegon County in Egelston Township and will be the only facility in the Township
- No wetland, 100-year floodplain, lake, stream, public park, game area, or wildlife refuge is located within 300 feet of the proposed landfill
- Property not registered under the Farmland and Open Space Preservation Act




Siting Requirements (continued)

- Nearest public airport is more than 10,000 feet from the proposed facility
- Property is zoned Agricultural and Resort (R5)
- Site is accessed directly from Apple Avenue, an allweather paved road, via the facility's existing entrance
- No residence or commercial building is within 500 feet of the facility except buildings owned by the County of Muskegon
- Achieves isolation requirements of Part 115



Proposed Site Plan





Conceptual Design

- Site will include a state of practice double composite liner system with a leak detection layer
- Leachate collection and removal system will prevent liquids from building up on the liner
- Final cover system designed to prevent precipitation infiltration and control gas emissions
- Gas collection system to allow continued beneficial use of generated landfill gas
- Stormwater control features to minimize erosion and sedimentation



Operations Summary

- Proposed expansion will accept Type II MSW
- Existing facilities will remain in use (offices, scale)
- Day to day operations and daily cover procedures will be consistent with current operations
- Collection of landfill gas for beneficial use
- Leachate collection and transferred to WWT facility



Site Monitoring

- Extensive groundwater monitoring network sampled on a quarterly basis
- Landfill gas monitoring in compliance with air use permit and to prevent accumulation of explosive gases
- Regulatory review of all monitoring data for conformance with applicable regulations



Anticipated Impact on Existing System

- Provide continued disposal within County boundaries
- Little to no anticipated impact on the existing solid waste recycling, household hazardous waste collection, tire collection, and related management system efforts
